### A Note from Our Leadership

What a year we've had, Mississauga! With COVID-19 recovery and rising costs of living, community members like you have continued to show an outpouring of generosity.

Your support has enabled us to keep up with demand in real-time as inflation and a lack of adequate government support is leaving our low-income neighbours in poverty.

All of us see higher prices everywhere from fueling up at the pumps to filling up grocery baskets. This now means that 1 in 5 Canadians expect to need food from a community organization, like The Mississauga Food Bank, before the end of the year.<sup>1</sup>

As long as our neighbours face food insecurity, your continued support ensures we will be here to provide and promote access to healthy and appropriate food.

Your support enables us to keep up with the increased need for food. This year we distributed 300% more food than when we moved into our facility in 2014 - this is why we are searching for a new building to call home as we have long outgrown our space.

In the following pages, you will see how your support helped your neighbours this past year - providing nutritious food, allowing them to use their limited resources for other expenses, helping with tax returns, and more. We hope you are inspired by reading about all the good that your donations are doing in Mississauga!

The Mississauga Food Bank is the central food bank in Mississauga, leading a network of over 50 agencies that distributes food for over 5 million meals each year to vulnerable children, seniors, families, and neighbours in Mississauga.

### Agency Spotlight: Sakeenah Homes



Sakeenah Homes is one of the agencies that joined The Mississauga Food Bank network this year. They run transitional shelters for those needing housing, many of whom are women and children, newcomers, or refugees.





While families with children continue to make up the largest share of households, the number of single-person households that have to turn to a food bank continues to grow.

**1 in 10 people in Mississauga are considered low-income** - that's 66,740 neighbours in need.<sup>3</sup> The average monthly income for a food bank user is \$1,531.

Those who already have to stretch their paycheques or make sacrifices between basic necessities can't afford to spend more on groceries. As we continue to see the cost of groceries climb, **your continued support puts food on the tables of hungry neighbours who would otherwise go without.**

### **Advocate!:** Fight to improve Ontario's Social Assistance programs

30% of food bank users in Mississauga rely on social assistance as their main source of income. With a single person receiving a maximum of only \$733 through Ontario Works (OW) or \$1,169 through the Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) per month, social assistance rates have not kept up with rising inflation and do not cover the true costs of food, clothing, rent, and other basic necessities.

This is legislated poverty. Contact your Member of Provincial Parliament and ask them to prioritize increasing social assistance rates to the \$2,000/month benchmark set by CERB and tying future increases to inflation.

fruit and veggies.







It is vital to provide not only food to neighbours in need but food that is healthy and nutritious and includes items like fresh fruit and vegetables. **Your donations enable us to help increase their access to fresh food**. Modelled after a traditional farmer's market, our Community Market allows neighbours in high priority neighbourhoods to 'shop' for the free, fresh produce they need.









Our ReclaimFRESH Food Rescue Program works with farmers, wholesalers, producers, and grocery stores to rehome surplus fresh food.

This year, you enabled us to build vital partnerships with Ontario farmers, who provide large quantities of surplus, high-quality, fresh food every week.

### Advocate!: Fight for adequate investment in affordable housing

3 out of 4 food bank users say affordable housing would most significantly change their quality of life.

In the last two years, the waitlist for affordable housing in Peel nearly doubled to 28,227 people.<sup>6</sup>

Use your voice and your vote to tell elected officials to create and repair more social and supportive housing units, and expand protections for low-income renters.

The Food Bank 2 Home Delivery Program brings custom food orders directly to neighbours who are homebound due to long-term illness, physical disability, or other barriers. **Your support and our team of dedicated volunteers make it all possible!**

### Advocate!: Build a stronger workforce

Workers need access to stable employment that provides a living wage and at least 5 paid sick days, and government assistance programs should not be slashed when folks gain employment in minimum wage jobs.





**Donations & Income**

**Expenses** 


