When we were founded in 1986 as FoodPath Interfaith Peel Association to Tackle Hunger, we were a small-scale operation meant to provide only food for those in need. In 2009, we became The Mississauga Food Bank, and a year later, we transitioned to our current hub and spoke distribution model to reach more neighbours across the city. PRESENT

A YEAR OF CHANGE

This past year has brought about much change for our organization. To start — we are now Food Banks Mississauga! We continue to do the vital work of serving our community under this new name and leading our network of over 60 agency members to provide healthful and appropriate food to neighbours facing food insecurity across Mississauga.

In a year of major changes, we also moved in April! It was a monumental task that took our entire team's careful coordination and tireless work. As we had long outgrown our previous facility, this relocation to a 43,000 square foot facility was the only way to keep up with the urgent, increased demand across our city. Almost 5% of the population of Mississauga now uses a food bank – 82% more than before the pandemic*. That's nearly 36,000 people in your community who are receiving emergency food to alleviate the food insecurity they face.

In the following pages, you will read about how we continue to meet this growing need head-on with innovative programs, made possible by your support. You will also hear from food bank users who have been positively impacted by your contributions.

WHO IS FOOD BANKS MISSISSAUGA?

Food Banks Mississauga is the leading food security organization in Mississauga. We lead a network of 60+ agency members, including neighbourhood food banks, pantries, cupboards and meal and snack programs, working together to realize a food-secure Mississauga. Through our network, we provide healthy and appropriate food for almost 6 million meals each year to neighbours facing food insecurity across Mississauga.

WHO IS FACING FOOD INSECURITY IN MISSISSAUGA?


From June 2022 to May 2023, Food Banks Mississauga served 18% more users than the previous year, 82% more than pre-pandemic¹.

These numbers tell us more about who your generosity supports. They also paint a picture of the unique challenges our community faced this year, with new record-breaking numbers of first-time food bank users and Ukrainian newcomers.

Children: 11,043 (10% increase from previous year)

1 out of every 4 food bank users receive income support through the Ontario Disability Support

Program² (ODSP). The most that a single person on ODSP can receive is \$1,308/month.

16% of food bank users report that their primary income is from employment. This is on the rise as wages fail to keep up with the cost of living.



Almost **1/3** of food bank users have been in Canada for 10 years or less.

12% of food bank users this year were Ukrainian.



COMMUNITY MARKET: A POP-UP FOOD BANK

Modelled after a farmer's market, our Community Market brings free, fresh fruit, vegetables and more to neighbours in high-priority neighbourhoods, giving them the opportunity to 'shop' for what they need.

FOOD BANKS MISSISSAUGA

The Food Bank 2 Home Delivery Program brings custom food orders directly to homebound neighbours. Each order consists of fresh, frozen and shelf-stable food of the neighbour's choosing (plus personal care items!). Your support through monetary gifts and volunteering makes it all possible! Food Bank 2 Home rapidly expanded at the onset of the pandemic, and this year the program re-focussed efforts to prioritize serving neighbours who have short- or long-term illnesses, physical disabilities, or face other barriers. We have new relationships with community health and senior service partners to reach those who are at the highest risk, and we now have room to grow!

In our new warehouse, we've optimized the shopping model for volunteers by adding grocery store shelves, two fridges and freezers, larger packing tables, and a dedicated loading door.

FOOD BANKS MISSISSAUGA

The ReclaimFRESH Food Rescue Program works with local farmers, wholesalers, producers, and grocery stores to rehome a portion of the 2.3 million tonnes of surplus edible food in Canada that is wasted each year.¹

AGENCY SPOTLIGHT: SEVA FOOD BANK

In addition to leading and providing food to our network of agency members, Food Banks Mississauga also provides funding and opportunities for growth. One of these is the **Agency Capacity Building Fund**, which is awarded to select agency members to enhance food bank users' experience, collect data, or purchase appropriate equipment.

"Seva Food Bank has a long-standing relationship with Food Banks Mississauga. Receiving funding from the Capacity Building Fund allowed Seva to purchase a 2-door freezer, which allows us to provide frozen, pre-made meals to the large population of Ukrainian temporary residents currently living in hotels. These individuals' only means for cooking is a microwave, so it is imperative we provide these 'heat and eat' meals, to help ease one burden from their already tumultuous lives."

Volunteers – thank you for providing your valuable time to run an Income Tax Filing Clinic to help neighbours file their taxes! With your support, low-income households were able to receive tax benefits that provided much-needed additional funds they wouldn't have received without the resources to file their tax return.

Helping neighbours receive these funds is another way we work towards "A Mississauga Where Everyone Is Food Secure" – when folks have money in their pockets, they can afford to buy the food they need.

UKRAINIAN SUPPORT PROGRAM

Your support met a new urgent need this year with agility and innovation. When Ukrainian temporary residents arrive in Canada, they are housed in hotels for their first two weeks and are not provided with food or immediate access to financial support. Many turned to Food Banks Mississauga, often walking upwards of an hour each way to access a food bank.

In collaboration with Peel Multicultural Council and Achev, we now bring food directly to these newcomers where they need it most, with a focus on food they can prepare in hotels and shelters with limited kitchen appliances.

To create a food secure Mississauga, we provide food to those who need it now *and* advocate to decrease the barriers that prevent food bank users from living poverty-free.


